

## Ladybirds of the UK


This sheet shows many of the common ladybird species found in the UK.

<b>Eyed ladybird</b> <i>Anatis ocellata</i>  Length: 7 – 8.5mm Habitat: Coniferous trees	<b>Striped ladybird</b> <i>Myzia oblongoguttata</i>  Length: 6 – 8mm Habitat: Coniferous trees	<b>Harlequin ladybird (non-native species)</b> <i>Harmonia axyridis</i>  Length: 6 – 8mm Habitat: Generalist Note: The two most common forms of this very variable species are shown	<b>7-spot ladybird</b> <i>Coccinella 7-punctata</i>  Length: 5 – 8mm Habitat: Generalist
<b>Cream-streaked ladybird</b> <i>Harmonia 4-punctata</i>  Length: 5 – 6mm Habitat: Coniferous trees	<b>Orange ladybird</b> <i>Halyzia 16-guttata</i>  Length: 4.5 – 6mm Habitat: Deciduous trees	<b>2-spot ladybird</b> <i>Adalia 2-punctata</i>  Length: 4 – 5mm Habitat: Generalist Note: Two forms of this very variable species are shown	<b>Cream-spot ladybird</b> <i>Calvia 14-guttata</i>  Length: 4 – 5mm Habitat: Deciduous trees
<b>Kidney-spot ladybird</b> <i>Chilocorus renipustulatus</i>  Length: 4 – 5mm Habitat: Deciduous trees	<b>Adonis' ladybird</b> <i>Hippodamia variegata</i>  Length: 4 – 5mm Habitat: Diverse, usually sandy soils	<b>10-spot ladybird</b> <i>Adalia 10-punctata</i>  Length: 3.5 – 4.5mm Habitat: Deciduous trees, hedgerows Note: Two forms of this very variable species are shown	<b>14-spot ladybird</b> <i>Propylea 14-punctata</i>  Length: 3.5 – 4.5mm Habitat: Generalist
<b>Pine ladybird</b> <i>Exochomus 4-pustulatus</i>  Length: 3 – 4.5mm Habitat: Coniferous and deciduous trees	<b>22-spot ladybird</b> <i>Psyllobora 22-punctata</i>  Length: 3 – 4mm Habitat: Grassland	<b>24-spot ladybird</b> <i>Subcoccinella 24-punctata</i>  Length: 3 – 4mm (hairy) Habitat: Grassland	<b>16-spot ladybird</b> <i>Tythaspis 16-punctata</i>  Length: 3mm Habitat: Grassland
